NEW ON OL' HACKERS BBS

Upload a disk: or two to your OWN private data/utility base and retrieve them at a later date when you purchased more disks. That's one of the many uses of a personal storage data/utility base. Another is if your on-line and you are scanning through the message bases of either WQNR or OL' Hackers BBS and come up with an idea for an article for the you can write a quick outline and save it to your personal data base to download then or at a later date. With this option you will always have the outline and it would be fresh in your mind to what you wanted to write the article about. Also you will have that available to send files across to another user's data/utility base. Your saying what do you mean by that? Easy. Lets say that you have a file a member of the group needs and you have it in your personal directory all you would have to do is type in at the command prompt.. Example Below:

```

After you have type in the user name and the file you sent you then will leave a little message that the file that, that user wanted from you is in that user's database for her/his to download. Remember that you'll NEVER have to type in the Drive number just the names or commands of the items you wish to do. If you look at the Help menu listed below you will get an understanding of all the commands available to you.

News From The OI' Hackers/WQNR BBS

March 1989
All BBS Updates Posted Here



Coming soon to The OI' Hackers BBS will be a user Utility Storage DataBase. You ask "What is that?" Well did you ever run out of disk space or disks, and couldn't get out and buy some. Well this can solve part of the problem in an emergency fast. What you would do is Upload a Disk or two, to your own private data utility base and retrieve it at a later date or when you bought some new disks. That's one of the many uses of a personal storage data/utility base on either WQNR or OI' Hackers BBS. Another good use for the utility data base is access to the online W/P.

With the access to the online W/P you'll be able to write a quick outline for a newsletter item that you have an idea for and don't want to forget what you have on your mind. You would write the outline then download it for your reference later on when you're ready to write the complete story. Also the availability to send files from your directory to another club member for them to see, it could be either a text file or a program. You Say "How would I send a file to another club member while online?" That's easy all you would have to do is type in the following in the example listed below:

```
[Fsch]D:Your Dir>  
Command>Send Kris Robins Filename.Ext
```

After you have typed in the command SEND you would then type in the name

of the user you wish to send it to followed by the full filename and its extender. The user that you sent the file to will automatically be notified that there's a file(s) waiting for he/she in their data base (This is not like Filemail). Remember! you will NEVER! have to type in the Drive numbers this has already been done in the program for you. What about on-line help files? The answer is yes there will be plenty of on-line help files if you have any problems. What commands are there available in the User/Utility/Storage/DataBase? To start off with there are 28 commands. Split down into categories you have (7) Directory/Disk Commands (10) File Commands and (11) Mic. Commands that you will need and would come in handy. Now what are these commands I'm talking about, well lets take a look.

Here are the Directory/Disk Commands.

- 1 DIR Long Directory
- 2 DIRS Short Directory (Atari 2.5)
- 3 CREDIR Create your own Directory
- 4 DELDIR Delete a directory you Make
- 5 CWD Change working directory
- 6 COUNT Count files you have
- 7 CHKDSK Check Disk how much room

Here are the File Commands you have. In the following Commands there will be no WILD CARDS ALLOWED! Like ERASE *.*

- 1 ERASE Erase one file at a time
- 2 DELETE Same as ERASE Command
- 3 RENAME Rename one file at a time
- 4 TYPE View a small 40 column file
- 5 VIEW A file that is any size or type
- 6 LOCK Lock one file at a time
- 7 UNLOCK Unlock one file at a time
- 8 Whereis Find a file you want fast
- 9 UPLOAD/DOWNLOAD

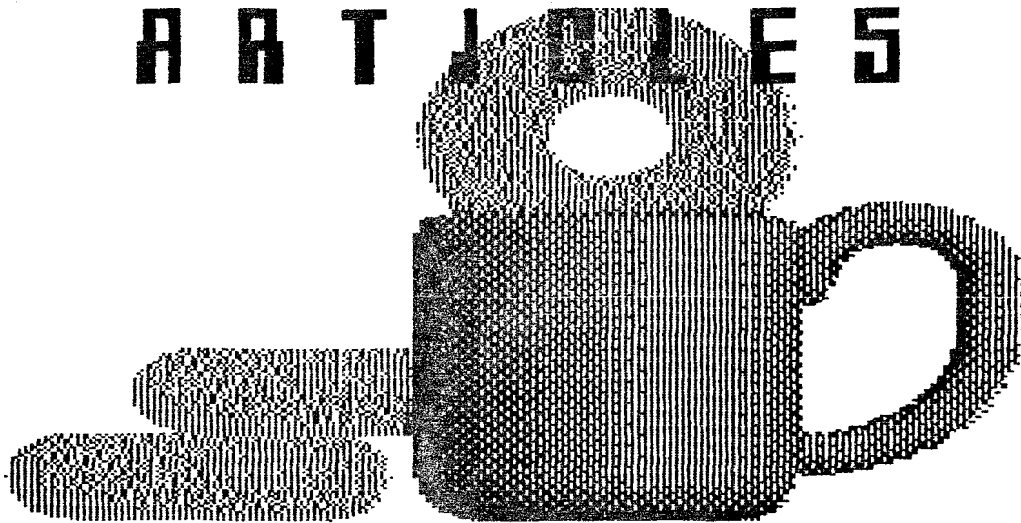
Here are the Extra and Mic. Commands.

- 1 CHAT Call for the Sysop
- 2 SMAIL Send E-Mail to a user
- 3 RMAIL Read Your E-Mail
- 4 FMAIL Send File Mail to a User
- 5 FSEND Send a File
- 6 FBACK Send Feed Back to The Sysop
- 7 EYE Logoff the BBS
- 8 SHOWTIME Check the current time
- 9 SHOWDATE Check current date
- 10 HELP or ? For The Help Files
- 11 EXIT or X Exit back to the BBS

More Commands will be added as needed. If you become part of this innovation do leave feedback to what you would like added to the User/Utility/Work/Data Base. There always room to make more commands available for any idea that you might have and would like to see implemented on The OI' Hackers BBS.

Now for a NEW Update! ver. 2.0 of Express Pro! was released on 2/25/89 with some NEW! features. One of the newest features is Y-Modem Batch Downloading. If you would like to use the option of Y-Modem Batch you must have DETERM ver. 1.59d. I suggest if you don't have it all ready the download it with all its associated files. With ver. 2.0 of Pro! came alot of changes that you will see on the BBS. One my end one of them was FILEMAIL with vers 1.0 to 1.4d there wasn't any problems with FILEMAIL. With the release of ver. 2.0 there were major problems with the old filemail. Now with the new filemail there are more added features one of them is a way to send a file from file sig to a user you want to send it to in filemail. No more will you have to upload a file that's on the Board Allready. ENJOY!!

WHY A USERS CLUE? by ALEX FIGNATO

The following is not intended as a review of or an endorsement of the STAR MICRONICS printers, although it will probably read that way

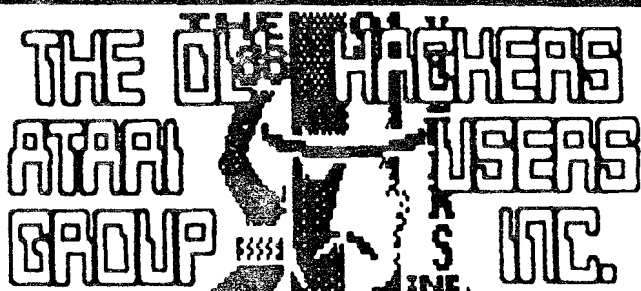
Recently I received a call from our FLORIDIAN member, DENNIS KLINE, advising me that his faithful GEMINI 10X printer had finally given up the ghost, and that he would have to buy a new printer. We spoke for a while, and he remembered that I had purchased a STAR NX10 for my daughter a while back, and how pleased both she and I were with the printer. I reminded DENNIS that STAR MICRONICS had come out with a later model called NX 1000, and he should consider it as it was said to be 100% compatible with the de facto standard, EPSON, but somewhat cheaper. He called me a couple days later and told me he had bought it. He then proceeded to tell me how good it was, and some of its features, and mostly, how happy he was that he bought it, in spite of the lukewarm review in one of the magazines.

About 1 week ago GEORGE DENNIS called and told me his ATARI 1027 had broken down and he needed another printer post haste. He remembered a conversation at one of our monthly meetings where I had told him about the two printers I had bought, and how pleased I was. He asked me for some advice on printers. I told him that my experience was very limited and in no way could I be considered a guru on printers, however I told him what DENNIS KLINE had told me about his new NX 1000, and suggested he call DENNIS KLINE in FLORIDA, and yet his evaluation, then I told him to call KRIS HOLTEGAARD, who could direct him to stores on LONG ISLAND that sell the interface's and cables.

END OF STORY--- GEORGE DENNIS spoke to me today, and said he bought the NX 1000 printer, interface and cables. Hooked it all up and was happily printing out his financial programs (GEORGE is a number cruncher, and as he says, "I'm not interested in graphics or sound, JUST NUMBERS"). He is as pleased as punch with his printer

MORAL OF THE STORY--- Because of the close connection and cooperation of 4 ATARI owners through membership in the OL' HACKERS club, GEORGE DENNIS was able to buy a needed item with the best advice and judgement of three FRIENDS, who would not have even known each other were it not for the club.

DATAQUE UPDATE

Chuck Steinman from DataQue Software
to present information and answer
questionns concerning the Turbo-816x
project.

about the Turbo-816. I am receiving
dozens of letters daily, so please do
not get discouraged if the questions
you ask are not specifically answered.
If time permits I try to answer them
all, but things are kind of hectic at
times.

For those not familiar with the
Turbo-816, it is an adapter board for
the Atari XL/XE computers which will
replace the current 6502c 8-bit
processor, with a new 16-bit central

processor system. The Turbo-816 is
compatible with mast of the existing
hardware, and software for the Atari
8-bit computers. With the "Dual-Prom"
option so far only a handfull of
existing programs have been
incompatible. Programs which have been
incompatible with the Turbo-OS alone
have been those which have used
illegal entry points into the Atari
OS.

The Turbo-816x will come as a kit with
everything you should need to get
started, some additional items will be
needed under certain installations,
and these are listed in the
Turbo-Install Guide. These items are
things like IC sockets, a toggle
switch, wire, and soldrr. Tools needed
to install a Turbo-816x include a
phillips screwdriver, soldering iron,

Prices for these items and other new items will be released as the items become available. Many items will be developed according to demand, and the price and availability will be adjusted to reflect that demand.

The Turbo-816 is a small 2.5" by 5" (approx) board which is mounted inside an Atari XL/XE computer system. It is

connected via a 40 position ribbon cable to the existing CPU socket. The old Atari 0-bit processor is removed, and if needed a 40 pin socket installed to allow the Turbo-816x DIP plug to be inserted.

The Turbo-OS is a 28 pin PROM, which is installed either as a replacement for the Atari OS PROM, or in addition to the Atari OS. This is determined by the installation performed. On the 1200x1 there are two 24 or 28 pin prams, and in some cases the "Dual-From" option is not available due to those production runs having 24 pin PROMs.

In any case, if the installation is performed as instructed in the Turbo Install Guide, the original Atari OS, and CPU can be re-installed if the Turbo-816 should ever need to be serviced. There would not need to be any de-soldering to remove the Turbo-816x if those directions are followed correctly.

If your Atari computer has its CPU, and PROM in sockets, then the actual installation time, should be well under an hour. If you must de-solder the original OS, and CPU, then the time would be longer.

There is currently only one wire that has to be added to the Atari XL/XE motherboard to make the Turbo-816x work. This wire is connected to an unused pin on the Atari 6502c CPU IC socket, so if the Turbo-816x should have to be removed, it would not effect operation with the Atari CPU at all.

Currently there are 24 beta test sites which are testing their hardware and software under several configurations of the Turbo-816x. They are by now, in the second stage of their testing, and the results of the first stage should be available by the conference.

Results so far have been very good, and a few programming bugs have been located and corrected. While most people may not understand how difficult it is to write an operating system of this type from scratch (including Atari) and still maintain the compatibility with the original OS.

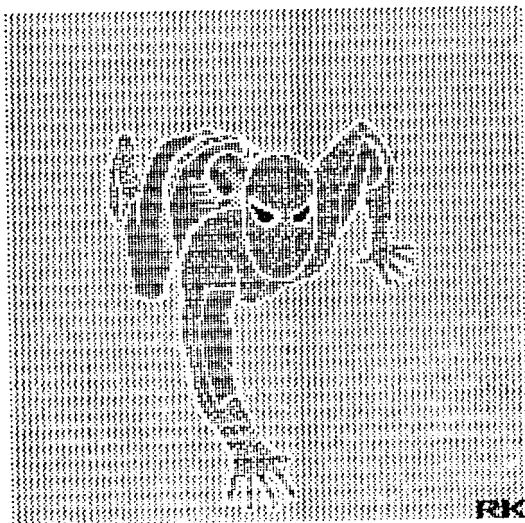
